Amy never imagined being a widow. In the weeks following Will's passing, she found herself searching all over for crucial information. Even with the support of her CSP family, relatives and friends, Amy struggled to manage all of the steps involved and wished that time sensitive and required documents were located all in one place, for easy reference.

develop a Benefits Guide for
first responder families

and federal resources and is
available to and utilized by first
responder and law enforcement
